Grant Amount

- **Connecting Kids to Nature Program with the Radnor Conservancy** **\$3,000**
This program created a campus-based outdoor learning space and demonstration garden area to enhance habitat for birds, insects and other species at IES and RES.
- **AP Computer Science & Technology II** **\$750**
AP computer science students built computers and robots and donated to the MARS program to extend classroom curriculum after AP exams.
- **RMS and RHS Chamber Music Coaching** **\$2,500**
Fifty orchestra students in grades 6 through 12 received intensive chamber music coaching by professional musicians culminating in a joint performance at the annual Orchestra Parents Association Tea.
